

"As a student in a Medical School, I was not taught about psychological and spiritual problems — and this made all the difference! Give personalized attention to the patient. That way, when they die, we feel bad and grieve with the family — it was all so different for me."

We are also immensely grateful for your guidance and stewardship. Thank you, Dr Nambudripad, for the selfless service, to DEAN Foundation, that you offer even today, setting a sterling example for others to emulate!

Is there anything in the community we're missing? How can we better educate our communities and how can we improve access? Mission:



 Omandurar






DEAN Foundation's Out-patient Centers are visited by patients referred by over 150 doctors in Chennai alone. Patients also approach us through word-of-mouth referrals and through the website. Over 80% of our patients are from the lower income group, devastated financially and traumatized physically, mentally & emotionally by life-limiting, advanced, incurable and chronic diseases.

- First Paediatric Palliative Care project in the Tamil Nadu Government Health Care System
- Specialty Ward housed in ICH, one of Asia's premier institutes, handed over to DEAN Foundation for renovation and staffing
- Facilitates a multidisciplinary team approach with consultation of specialists from other disciplines providing seamless care

Rural Outreach Integrated Hospice & Palliative Care and Geriatric Support Services, Kancheepuram

- First pilot rural Palliative Care project (4 months) in collaboration with the Dept. of Health and Family Welfare, Gov't of Tamil Nadu, under National Health Mission sanctioned on 29th Dec. 2009
- First NGO to be given a place in the Government Upgraded Primary Health Centre in Thiruppukuzhi, Kancheepuram Dist. to provide Palliative Care Services
- First Rural Outreach Hospice project continuing at the end of the pilot project under the government Heath Care System in Kancheepuram District
- First NGO allowed to assist the Palliative Care Out-Patient Clinic at the Government Arignar Anna Memorial Cancer Institute, Kancheepuram District
- Trains Anganwadi workers and Nurses in various parts of Kancheepuram District in the philosophy of Palliative Care

Integrated Palliative Care and Geriatric Rural Outreach Project, Karamadai, Coimbatore

Home Care Visits in collaboration with SBI Foundation – Project SBI Anugraha was initiated in Karamadai Block, Coimbatore District on 7 May 2017.

DEAN Foundation owns an acre of land in Karamadai Block, located 35 Km from Coimbatore and 8 Km from Mettupalayam, off Coimbatore – Mettupalayam Highway. Activities include Home Care visits in and around Karamadai Block and Awareness Camps conducted in villages.





For the elderly, DEAN's multidisciplinary team provides skilled service that achieves the hospice goal of promoting safety, independence, meaning and quality of life, despite the physical and mental decline.
